On September 1, 2019, Jim Corman became Orano Canada's new President and CEO.

CLUFF LAKE RECEIVES RENEWAL OF DECOMMISSIONING LICENCE

On July 25, 2019, Orano Canada was pleased to receive the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission's (CNSC) renewed and amended licence for the decommissioned Cluff Lake Project.

The new Cluff Lake Licence is valid for a period of five years from August 1, 2019 to July 31, 2024.

The related CNSC news release, record of decision and public hearing webcast are available on their website at www.nuclearsafety.gc.ca.

The Cluff Lake site physical decommissioning is now complete and we have demonstrated that the site is safe, stable and ready to be transferred into the Saskatchewan provincial Institutional Control Program (ICP), pending administrative, regulatory and funding negotiation process.

The Cluff Lake decommissioning environmental objectives have been met and are expected to continue to be met in the future. Consequently, the renewed Cluff Lake Licence applies to a land surface of 357.4 hectares, while 1,275 hectares were removed from reference under the licence as this land was either not impacted by past operations or was remediated and requires no further controls.

We thank all the employees involved in the Cluff Lake Project relicensing process, site monitoring and assessment. We also thank the community groups, business representatives and other stakeholders who intervened during the public hearing process. We look forward to continue to discuss Cluff Lake and to share knowledge of the area as we advance through the provincial ICP process.
